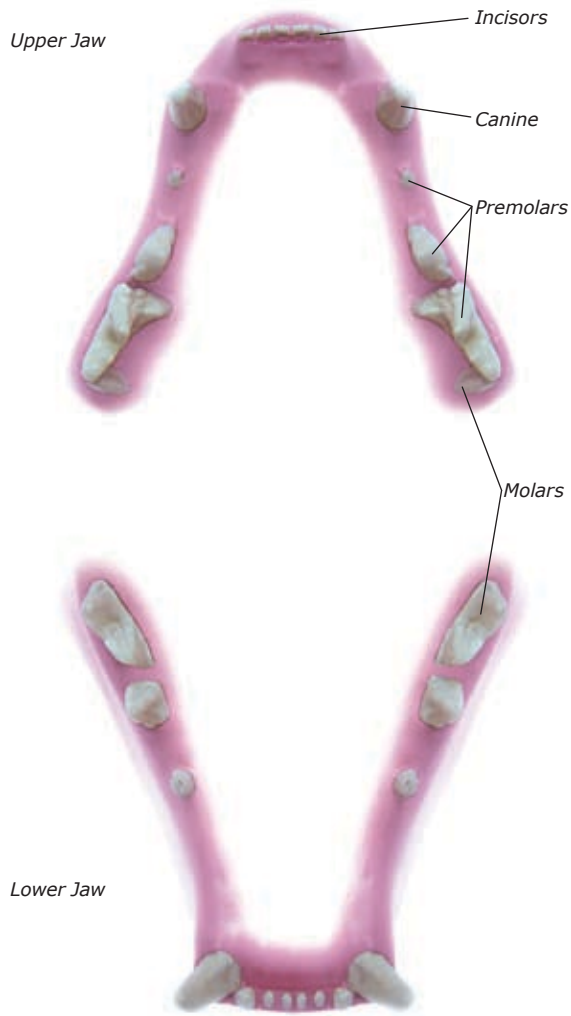

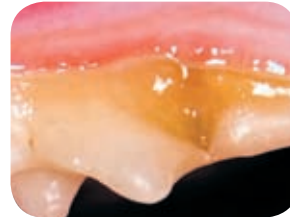

Minimal plaque and tartar on the tooth surface.



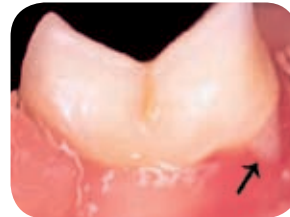
Gingivitis:

Moderate periodontal disease:
Pustular discharge, bleeding and bad breath.



Advanced periodontal disease:
Bleeding gums, mobile teeth and severe bad breath.
