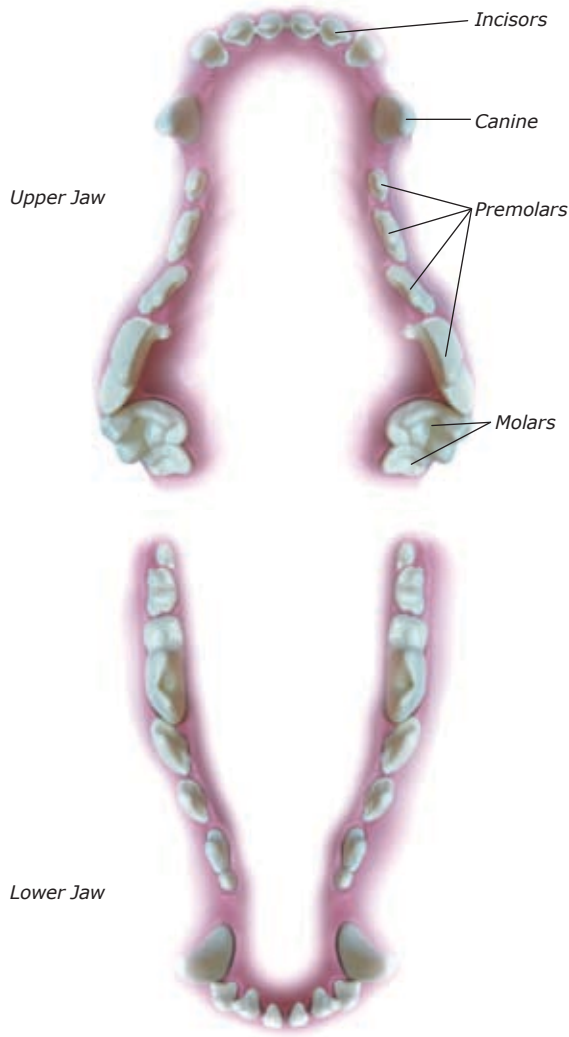

Key to notations:

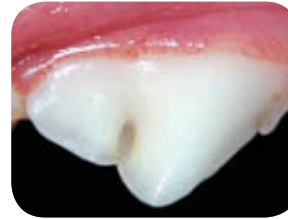
- RD** Retained deciduous teeth

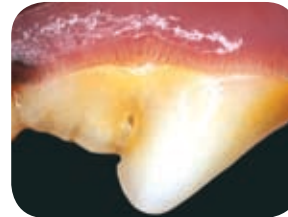
Treatment necessary?

Healthy teeth and gums:
Minimal plaque and tartar on the tooth surface.



Gingivitis:
Plaque and slightly disagreeable mouth odor.



Early periodontal disease:
Gum inflammation, swelling and moderate bad breath.



Moderate periodontal disease:
Pustular discharge, bleeding and bad breath.



Advanced periodontal disease:
Bleeding gums, mobile teeth and severe bad breath.
