The science is clear: preventive dental care in dogs is essential, and daily interventions such as properly formulated dental chews can play a vital role.

Among the leaders in canine dental science, the team at Mars Petcare, working closely with the Waltham Petcare Science Institute, has devoted decades to understanding oral health

in pets and creating safe, effective tools to support oral health. This article draws from an in-depth interview with three experts in the field: **Anna Alexander**, an animal scientist, former veterinary nurse and [RSPCA](#) inspector, and Mars product safety specialist with 25 years in care and treats; **Dr. Rebecca Wright**, a biologist and the Global Health and Well-Being Science Technical Leader in oral care with a PhD in cellular and molecular biology; and **Dr. Jessica Gilliam**, a veterinarian with over 14 years of practice, including leadership roles at [Banfield Pet Hospital\(open in new tab\)](#). Their combined expertise offers a rare, behind-the-scenes look at why dental health matters for dogs, and how GREENIES™ support it.

Why Canine Dental Health Matters

According to Dr. Jessica Gilliam, oral health is not just a cosmetic concern:

The mouth contains millions of bacteria. Not only do these bacteria produce smelly compounds and cause bad breath, the bacteria can travel through other parts of the body including the liver, heart and kidney and cause illness as well.

Dental disease in dogs often starts with plaque, a sticky film that accumulates within hours after eating. If not removed, plaque hardens into tartar within a few days, leading to gum inflammation (gingivitis) and, eventually, periodontal disease. Dr. Rebecca Wright notes:

“Plaque builds up within a couple of hours, tartar builds up within a couple of days, and dogs can get gum disease within two to three weeks... Sporadic [dental care] doesn’t have much benefit... [daily intervention is much more effective\(open in new tab\)](#).”

If left untreated, periodontal disease is not only painful, sometimes leading to tooth root abscesses and extractions, but research has shown it impacts a dog’s quality of life. Dr. Wright references [Waltham studies\(open in new tab\)](#) proving that “dogs with poor oral health have a reduced quality of life,” affecting not just their physical comfort but their overall wellbeing.

The Science Behind GREENIES™ Dental Treats

GREENIES™ treats are carefully engineered to hit the “sweet spot” in texture, shape, and size for optimal dental cleaning. As Dr. Wright explains, “There’s a real fine balance in texture—not too hard, not too soft. When the tooth penetrates, it scrapes along the side to physically remove plaque.”

This ideal texture comes from a precise formulation using wheat flour, wheat gluten, and glycerin—a plant-based compound that acts as a plasticizer to give the treat the perfect flexibility for cleaning teeth. Some pet owners raise concerns about glycerin, assuming it contains sugar and could contribute to dental problems—similar to how sugar feeds cavity-causing bacteria in humans. Alexander addresses this directly: “Our glycerin is sugar-free. And unlike humans, [dogs rarely suffer from tooth decay \(caries\)\(open in new tab\)](#) in the same way, so glycerin poses no such risk. “It would no more build up plaque or tartar than anything else a dog eats... [and] all of our dental care products have no added sugars.”

The texture is essential because GREENIES™ work through mechanical cleaning—similar to the bristles of a toothbrush—to help prevent plaque and tartar buildup when fed daily. Their unique design also encourages chewing rather than swallowing whole, enhancing both cleaning action and safety.

The Risk Behind Hard Treats & Chews

Many pet parents believe that giving their dog hard chews like antlers, plastic toys and other treat options are beneficial for their teeth. While there may be plaque reduction from that chewing action, [hard chews also carry significant risk\(open in new tab\)](#):

“Products that are too hard can increase the risk of tooth fracture,” Dr. Wright cautions. [“Antlers \[can\] break a tooth\(open in new tab\)](#) because they are so hard.”

Alexander further explains, “You see slab fractures from too hard a product because... [dog] enamel isn't as strong as our teeth, so if they chew on something at the wrong angle, they can break their tooth.”

A fractured tooth is not only painful but may require extraction, further diminishing quality of life. The challenge is finding a chew that is firm enough to remove plaque through mechanical action, but not so hard that it risks breaking teeth.

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The Role of the Microbiome

Another important aspect of oral health is maintaining a balanced microbiome (community of bacteria in the mouth). Wiping out all bacteria, as some antiseptic products do, can disrupt the delicate balance of the oral microbiome, which could be detrimental. Dr. Wright explains:

“You want... good bacteria... out competing with the bad bacteria. Once the pathogenic bacteria have the environment to thrive... that’s what causes the problems.”

GREENIES™ support healthy oral conditions through mechanical cleaning and maintains the balance of a healthy oral microbiome.

GREENIES™ in the Broader Dental Care Routine

While brushing is the gold standard, just as with humans, most pet owners do not brush their dog’s teeth daily. Dr. Gilliam acknowledges this reality:

“Ideally [you’d be] brushing your dog’s teeth every single day. Who has time for that? Most people don’t... [so] besides brushing, dental chews [are] that next step.”

Daily GREENIES™ Dental Treats, when combined with regular veterinary checkups and professional cleanings, form a practical and effective routine for many dog owners.

Safety and Digestibility

When Mars acquired GREENIES™ in 2006, the global pet scientists & R&D teams prioritized implementing rigorous digestive solubility testing and formulation shifts to ensure safety

and efficacy of the dental treats.

Alexander, one of the lead scientists on developing and implementing the digestive solubility testing, explains, “We create an artificial dog’s stomach and an artificial dog’s small intestine... [The product] has to break down and... pass through the dog without causing any gastric upset.” She adds, “GREENIES™ has been through this test methodology... It has to break down and when we look at the filtrate at the end ...basically a thin layer that shows that it's broken down.” All products that go through this test have to meet a threshold before they are deemed safe for dogs to consume.

Another concern for pet parents when choosing a dental chew product is choking risk. Mars addresses this issue through structured risk assessments. Products are tested for size appropriateness, texture, and shape to minimize risk. She emphasizes that feeding the correct size chew for a dog’s weight is crucial: “Another concern about choking is when you feed the wrong size product to the wrong size dog... a small product to a large dog that thinks it can swallow it whole.”

Not all commercially available chews meet the same safety standards, but at Mars no care or treat product, including GREENIES™, reaches the market unless it passes these tests and standards.

Commitment to Science, Transparency, and Industry Standards

Mars Petcare doesn’t just use its research for product development; it shares findings with competitors, veterinary bodies, and regulatory agencies to raise industry standards. Wright notes their work on hardness limits for chews:

“We’ve gone out to various regulatory bodies globally... showed them the research... and made the lab methodology available externally... [The goal is] making it really available to people”

Similarly, Alexander is working on an improved artificial digestion system that could become an industry benchmark, just as their tooth fracture standard already has.

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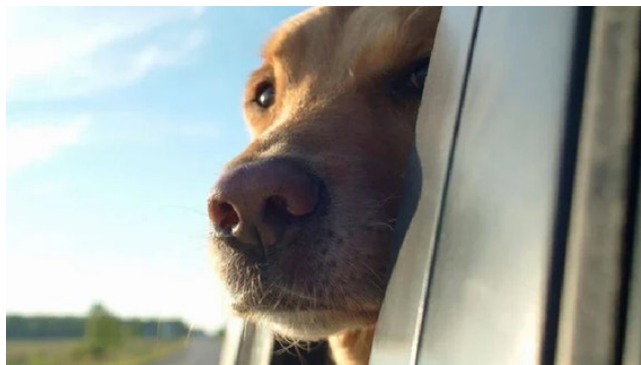

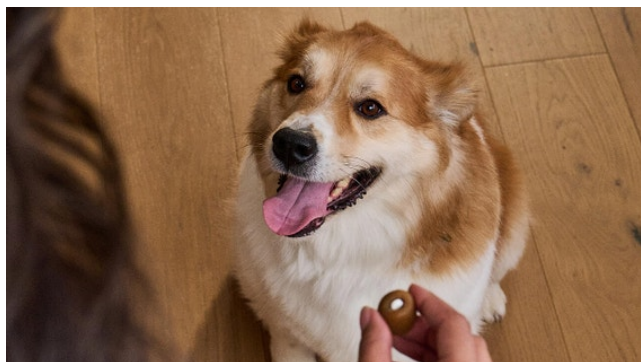
